Board Chair's Message and Message from the Executive Director

It is with regret the JAAA Board of Directors received and accepted the resignation of the president, Alden Hickman. Alden has been invited to be a full-time interim pastor for a church in the Topeka area. His work for JAAA has be an invaluable service to the improvement of our agency. Thank you Alden for all of your work, and especially for your foresight to help JAAA prepare for the next 25 years of service to the seniors within the JAAA area.

Lee Hedrick, Vice-Chair, has agreed to finish Alden's term as president. Lee is a retired RN who worked with the Douglas County Visiting Nurses for 26 years.

MESSAGE FROM THE **EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR**

The news reports are filled with the budget issues facing the State of Kansas. It is a grim picture, at best. Unfortunately,

some of the discussions being held regarding the budget have the potential to paint a grim picture for many seniors.

The Senior Care Act program targets those most frail seniors who are at risk of institutionalization but who are able to reside in

the community because some services are available. It is estimated that the SCA program will serve approximately 7,302 seniors for FY '03. The cost is projected at an annual average of \$1,158 per senior.

This particular program is facing a potential cut – a serious cut. Original discussions at the Capitol were as much as a 55%

cut of \$4.4 million. As the Legislature enters the Omnibus session, both the House and the Senate are working to restore the funding. The Senate sees the wisdom in restoring all of the funding that was originally cut. The House is discussing a restoration of half of the funding.

It is very distressing to hear of the cuts slated for this program. For every \$1,000,000 that is cut from this program, 848 seniors will lose services—the services that are literally keeping them out of nursing homes. However, when only 36 of those individuals (4% of those removed) do enter a nursing home, the cost will be that \$1,000,000 of expected savings. This very unfortunate budget situation has the State gambling at terrible odds.

More than 95% of the clients on this program have said these services are a significant factor in keeping them out of a nursing home. Yet, when only 4% of those seniors

whose services are cut do A cut in funding to enter a nursing home, there will be absolutely no cost savings.

New providers, coordinator come on board

WO NEW PROVIDERS OF OLDER recently named Terry McDaniel as its Americans Act (OAA) services recently have come on board.

NEW PROVIDERS

The Bert Nash Community Mental Health Agency (Lawrence) and Teach, Inc. (Topeka) will provide services under Title III-E of the OAA, the National Family Caregiver Support Program.

Title III-E of the OAA includes services geared to those who provide care to those age 60 and older and grandparents age 60 and older who provide primary care to children under age 19. Those services include:

- 1. Information.
- 2. Assistance.
- 3. Individual counseling/support groups/caregiver training.
- 4. Respite care.
- 5. Supplemental services.

The Bert Nash Community Mental Health Agency will offer individual counseling/support groups and training to caregivers.

Teach, Inc. will offer information, individual counseling/support groups and training to grandparent caregivers.

CAREGIVER COORDINATOR NAMED Jayhawk Area Agency on Aging (JAAA) Caregiver Specialist. The Caregiver Specialist is responsible for addressing the needs of the caregiver by providing information, referral, case management, making presentations in JAAA's service area, and networking with the private sector to assist in the development of new programs.

McDaniel was JAAA's Information and Outreach Specialist for the past three years and helped to make that department a positive force in the tri-county area. McDaniel and her husband Jerry have four children and three grandchildren.

Pfizer "Share Card"

Together RxTM is a prescription savings program that provides savings to qualified Medicare enrollees right at the pharmacy counter. Together RxTM is

- Brevity: the presentation must be short, wherever presented.
- Accuracy: the credibility of your testimony depends on the accuracy, check your facts.
- Preparation: anticipate questions, and establish position with clear and convincing evidence.
- Courtesy: be polite, not demanding. Might does not make right.
- Appreciation: Thank legislators for their time.


